While some providers like Planned Parenthood clinics may have emergency contraception on hand and can give you the pills directly, you will often also need to visit a pharmacy to fill the prescription just like you do with other medications. Emergency contraception can delay your period. Regulations on the sale of EC have changed frequently, so it can be quite confusing. The Plan B pill works best when you take it within 3 days after unprotected sex. INDICATIONS AND USAGE Plan B One-Step is a progestin-only emergency contraceptive indicated for prevention of pregnancy following unprotected intercourse or a known or suspected contraceptive failure. Plan B One-Step is available only by prescription for women younger than age 17 years, and. Do I need a prescription to get emergency contraceptive pills? Laws in some states also allow pharmacists to provide emergency contraceptive pills directly to women of all ages without requiring a doctor's prescription (although not every pharmacist is doing it). Do not take levonorgestrel (systemic) if you are pregnant. This medicine may interact with other drugs or health problems. Tell your doctor and pharmacist about all of your drugs (prescription or OTC, natural products, vitamins) and health problems. You must check to make sure that it is safe for you to take levonorgestrel. LEVONORGESTREL is an emergency contraceptive (birth control pill). It prevents pregnancy if taken within the 72 hours after unprotected sex. This medicine will not work if you are already pregnant. Compare progestins. Prescription Settings. levonorgestrel. (generic). Select Brand. levonorgestrel (generic). next choice. Levonorgestrel is used by women to prevent pregnancy after birth control failure (such as a broken condom) or unprotected sex. This medication is an emergency contraceptive and should not be used as a regular form of birth control. It is a progestin hormone that works mainly by preventing the release of an egg (ovulation). Jul 31, - These are generic versions of the drug in Plan B One-Step, levonorgestrel. They come as a single pill. Both should be in the family planning aisle, but you'll have to show ID to buy them. If you're under 17, you'll need a prescription. Double-dose generic levonorgestrel. The double-dose just means it's two. You can buy levonorgestrel morning-after pills (like Plan B One-Step, Next Choice One Dose, Take Action, and My Way) over the counter without a prescription at drugstores and pharmacies. It doesn't matter how old you are and it doesn't matter what your gender is. Sometimes the morning-after pill is locked up or kept.
