Mebendazole and other benzimidazole antihelminthics are active against both larval and adult stages of nematodes, and in the cases of roundworm and whipworm, kill the eggs, as well. Particularly the risk for Stevens-Johnson syndrome or toxic epidermal necrolysis may be increased. Neutropenia and agranulocytosis have been reported with high doses and prolonged use. In rare cases, it has been associated with a dangerously low white blood cell count, low platelet count , and hair loss, [12] [13] with a risk of agranulocytosis in rare cases. Mebendazole (MBZ) is a medication used to treat a number of parasitic worm infestations.
