

does medicare cover viagra prescriptions

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In most cases, the prescription drugs you get in a hospital outpatient setting , like an emergency department or during observation services, aren't covered by Part B. At the time you request a refill, provide written notice of the change and a day supply of the drug under the same plan rules as before the change. Provide written notice to you at least 60 days prior to the date the change becomes effective.
