Here's what I did experience: I am also on diazepam again the doctor suggested 2mg 3 x daily as a starting dose, but I upped it to 5mg she said this would be ok if I really needed to and even that is not cutting through the extreme panic it just frustrates me as it makes me even more tired, but I still can't sleep! I have recovered well enough to come off them and I've been med free for 2 weeks now. Rather than repeat myself, below are some links to my previous threads about my experiences. The one meal I tried to eat yesterday evening just had soup at lunch to be safe came back up until I was dry retching and there was nothing left. I just seem to react badly to SSRIs for some reason.
