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Laboratory Tests. Serum electrolytes (particularly potassium), CO<sub>2</sub>, creatinine and BUN should be determined frequently during the first few months of Lasix therapy and periodically thereafter. Serum and urine electrolyte determinations are particularly important when the patient is vomiting profusely or receiving parenteral. You must check to make sure that it is safe for you to take furosemide injection with all of your drugs and health problems. Do not start, stop, If you are taking furosemide injection and have high blood pressure, talk with your doctor before using OTC products that may raise blood pressure.
