You must be registered in the program and understand the risks and benefits of taking this medicine. Do not take a vitamin or mineral supplement that contains vitamin A. The major metabolite is 4-oxo-isotretinoin, with tretinoin and 4-oxo-tretinoin also found in the blood and urine. May increase the risk of osteomalacia.
