NSAIDs should be prescribed with extreme caution in those with a prior history of ulcer disease or gastrointestinal bleeding. These conditions can occur without warning while you are using ibuprofen, especially in older adults. Do not take more than your recommended dose. An ibuprofen overdose can damage your stomach or intestines. Use only the smallest amount of medication needed to get relief from your pain, swelling, or fever. The maximum dose of prescription ibuprofen for adults, elderly adults and adolescents is mg. per day, divided into three or four doses. The maximum dose of over-the-counter ibuprofen for the same groups is mg. per day divided into three or four doses. The maximum dose for children is based on body weight. Ibuprofen is the most commonly used and most frequently prescribed NSAID.2,3 It is a non-selective inhibitor of cyclo-oxygenase-1 (COX-1) and A low dose ibuprofen is as effective as aspirin and paracetamol for the indications normally treated with over the counter medications It is widely used as an analgesic, an anti. Low-dose, OTC ibuprofen has been used for pain relief for over 30 years without any obvious major health issues.
