What is this medicine used for? This medicine is given by IV infusion (slow drip through a needle into a large vein) to treat cutaneous T-Cell lymphoma (a kind of skin cancer) in people who have. What is this medicine? METHOXSALEN (me THOK suh luhn) is a skin coloring and light sensitizing agent. This medicine is given before ultraviolet radiation. It is used to treat the skin symptoms of cutaneous T-cell lymphoma. How to Use This Medicine. Injectable. Your doctor will prescribe your exact dose and tell you how often it should be given. This medicine is given as a shot directly into the bag used for the UV light treatment. A nurse or other health provider will give you this medicine. The invention relates to a methoxsalen injection which is prepared through the steps of dissolving a methoxsalen active pharmaceutical ingredient in an organic solvent, adding in propylene glycol, then adding in an isotonic adjusting agent to adjust the isotonicity of the injection, and finally adding in a buffer solution system.
