Do not take extra medicine to make up the missed dose. Your doctor may occasionally change your dose to make sure you get the best results. Tegretol may impair your thinking or reactions. You should not take Tegretol if you have a history of bone marrow suppression, or if you are allergic to carbamazepine or to an antidepressant such as amitriptyline, desipramine, doxepin, imipramine, or nortriptyline. The length of time a person needs to take carbamazepine depends on what problem is being treated.

For example, someone with an impulse control disorder usually takes the medicine only until behavioral therapy begins to work.
