Tablets and suspension should be kept at room temperature, between 15 C and 30 C (59 F and 86 F). Follow all directions on your prescription label. Do not take this medicine in larger or smaller amounts or for longer than recommended. Take Carafate on an empty stomach, at least 1 hour before or 2 hours after a meal.
