Mar 31, - Common Medications Given During Labor & the Effects on Mom and Baby: Below is a breakdown of common medications and interventions given during and after labor. Our hope is that by Percocet is the most common medication given to help mothers with pain management after delivery. It is an oxycodone/acetaminophen (Rx) Extended-release tablet (Xartemis XR): 2 tab PO q12hr without regard to food. Extended-release (Xartemis XR) is a bilayer formulation of oxycodone and acetaminophen (contains immediate- and extended-release layers) which is not interchangeable with. Labor and Delivery. IV: for delivery of fluids to keep you hydrated in labor. For access in case we need to give any IV medications. Fentanyl: IV narcotic given during a contraction to help decrease pain caused by contractions. Tylenol with Codeine or Percocet: usually 1 to 2 tabs by mouth taken for relief of perineal pain. Of course Ibuprofen has side effects (especially for pregnant women). The point is, Percocet isn't the only post-delivery pain medication available. You have options. Opioids cross the placenta and may produce respiratory depression and psycho-physiologic effects in neonates. An opioid antagonist, such as naloxone, must be available for reversal of opioid-induced respiratory depression in the neonate. Percocet is not recommended for use in pregnant women during.
